
Progressive Agriculture Safety Day[®] Program Overview

<u>Mission</u>: Provide education, training and resources to make farm, ranch and rural life safer and healthier for children and their communities.

Vision: No child would become ill, injured or die from farm, ranch and rural activities.



Sadly, studies in the United States indicate that every three days a child dies and every day 33 children are injured due to an agriculture-related incident. In Canada, 84 children under 15 years of age were killed in agricultural incidents from 2003 to 2012. Therefore, our mission and vision is on the forefront of the Progressive Agriculture Safety Day[®] program. Each year, we train hundreds of volunteers throughout North American to coordinate a one-day, ageappropriate, hands-on, fun and safe event for children. With more than 30 chapters of safety curriculum, the coordinators have the ability to customize

their school or community Safety Day based on the needs of their community. Fire, All-Terrain Vehicles (ATV), electricity, chemical, animal, lawn equipment, first aid, water and grain, are just a glimpse at some of the diverse topic areas.

The Progressive Agriculture Foundation (PAF) is a charitable 501(c)3 non-profit foundation that governs and secures funding solely for the Progressive Agriculture Safety Day[®] program. PAF works diligently to bring our safety messages and resources to local communities in need. Every \$13 (U.S. Dollars) raised helps send another child to a Progressive Agriculture Safety Day[®] in their local community, where they will receive hands-on learning in a variety of safety topics for use on the farm, ranch or at home. Additionally, all youth

participants and adult volunteers will receive a t-shirt, insurance coverage, a take-home bag and numerous other resources.
